



51 Adults earned their GEDs working in our program. Students work one-to-one or in small groups with trained volunteer tutors at flexible times and various public locations.

We have tutors working with students in 5 counties: Lapeer, Tuscola, Bad Axe, Shiawassee, and Sanilac. Our students are from throughout the Thumb Area of Michigan. Our partnership with GST Michigan Works! helps to make this possible.



Every year, one in six young adults—more than 1.2 million—drop out of high school.

Jennifer Nemchek started working on her GED credential in August, 2015, at the Family Literacy Center. For nearly four years, Nemchek worked with a tutor and diligently attended classes while preparing for each test subject.

Jennifer also dedicated her time to helping fellow classmates during their GED journeys. While taking classes she took on the role of Community Service Coordinator and started motivation and mindfulness classes to encourage other students. Nemchek plans to become a clinical psychologist. She has enrolled at a local community college and will start classes this fall.

"Jennifer was always willing to talk to a student who might be faltering in their studies or belief in their ability to get their GED," said Meredith Donahue, Adult Program Administrator at the Family Literacy Center. "She knows what she wants to do and what she needs to do to accomplish it. Jennifer has changed her mindset and sees setbacks not as failures, but as opportunities to learn."

STEPS



In 2018, we started a program we called "Next Steps." This program was designed to help support our students in their educational journey. We found that some of our student might stop working toward their goals when they had a housing problem, transportation issue, or other challenge. Sometimes this was a temporary stop. Sometimes it was permanent. Additionally, if they "completed" our program and got their GED, they frequently did not know what to do next. They did not know how to enroll in a training program or college, apply for financial aid, or create an effective resume. Our Next Steps Coordinator helped our students keep working toward their goals and gave them support to be successful. This program continues to be offered and is open to all Family Literacy Center students who need extra support.



















FROM NEXT STEPS TO JMG

In June of 2019, we were contacted by GST Michigan Works who wanted us to start a Jobs for Michigan's Graduates (JMG) Program. This program was similar to our Next Steps program in many ways. However, our JMG program specifically supports youth, ages 16-24, who are either working to earn their GED or are enrolled in an alternative education program. Additionally, the supportive and training services available to JMG participants are much more structured and intensive.



JMG is Michigan's branch of the national JAG (Jobs for

America's Graduates) Program. JMG's mission is to "equip young adults with the skills to overcome barriers and succeed in education, employment, and in life." More specifically, the participants in the Family Literacy Center's JMG Program learn soft skills to help them in the journey toward college, trades training, employment, or the military. They learn about things like resume writing, interview skills, personal finances, college enrollment, and financial aid. In 2018-2019, the statewide JMG Program saw a 95% graduation rate among seniors enrolled in JMG. Of those graduates, 67% went on to find gainful employment, while 41% went on to further their education. The resources and support offered by the JMG Program give Michigan's youth the skills and practice they need to achieve their goals.

Our JMG program was brand new in 2019. We plan to enroll and support at least 50 students in the program. We believe this is an incredible resource and opportunity for our students. We look forward to continuing this program in the Lapeer County area for many years to come.

We provided 4 child tutoring programs at the Lapeer District Library in 2019. This program was for 2nd - 5th grade students that struggle with math or reading, with a focus on students in 3rd grade.

We also provided two 10 week sessions of child tutoring called "Reading Buddies" to The Chatfield School and North Branch Elementary. This program focused on helping students in the 2nd grade who struggled with reading.

With the help of our trained volunteer tutors we were able to provide 774 hours of one-to-one tutoring for 65 elementary students. Since beginning our program in 2009, we have tutored 888 students.

Playgroups 2019

15 six-week playgroup sessions Total attendance: 1,362 ~ an average of over 15 people at each session

Thanks to a partnership with the Lapeer District Library, we were able to offer 12 Playgroups for families with young children. We were also able to offer 3 playgroups at North Branch Elementary through a donation from the Morgan Fike Memorial Fund. Playgroup targets children from birth to age 5 and their parents. At

playgroups, we facilitate learning and developmental activities while having fun. The program includes activities which help develop critical skills for young children including fine and large motor skills, social interaction, and listening and following directions. Kids do crafts with parents, listen to read-aloud stories, enjoy free–play time, and receive snacks and free books.

100% of parents who participated reported that, because of these workshops their child was more sociable and better prepared for school and that they had improved their parenting skills.

Comments included: "Great program! I recommend this program whenever I have the chance." "This is amazing. We love it!" "We really love the program!"

Ready, Set, Go! 2019

12 Programs, 129 Participants

Ready, Set, Go! offers information, instructional materials, and books for families with 3, 4, and 5 year olds preparing for kindergarten. Families participate in activities which help children develop critical school readiness skills.

100% of Participants reported that, because of these workshops, they have expanded their ability and are more confident in working with their children.

These programs are offered free to Lapeer County residents thanks to our partnership with the Lapeer District Library.




